## FIRST QUARTERLY

This is the First Quarterly of the Logan County Genealogical Society. It will be handed to members present at the January meeting and other members and those on the mailing list will get theirs through the mail.

## ONE YEAR OF PROGRESS

The Logan County Genealogical Society began in November, 1977, when seventeen women who were interested in studying their family history met to hear Mary Fouts, Extension Adviser, Home Economics from Tazewell County present a program on "Climbing Your Family Tree." Her advice was to "write down facts, keep an organized file, collect family stories in order to search out your roots." She displayed the contents of her "Search Bag" which she keeps packed and available when she has an opportunity to seek information at a county clerk's office, at a state historical library, at the state archives or when she goes searching in a cemetery.

Her "Search Bag" contains notebooks to be used for recording, a probe to use in searching for head stones that have been covered with dirt, a magnifying glass, pencils and a roll of paper to do rubbings.



In January, the group met at the Lincoln Public Library, where Mildred Devanny directed a workshop, using the references available at this facility. Logan County has 5 volumes of cemetery records. The State Genealogical Library does not use the Dewey Decimal System - 920 is history, 929 is genealogy. She recommended "Tracing Family Trees in Eleven States" R

1998 In spite of an ice and storm blocking some roads, thirteen women met on February 14. Mrs. Devanny talked with the group about Migration patterns. She displayed several maps showing migrations.

Another workshop was held in March.

Each monthly meeting was publicized in the local and area newspaper and on the radio station. By April, men were calling in asking that the group meet at night so that they might attend. An evening meeting was arranged and six men joined the group.

In May, (Mrs. Ernest) Emily McElhaney was elected president of the Logan County Genealogical Society. Other officers elected were: Mrs. C.W. Gordy (Helen), vice president; Lester Wickline, second vice president; Harriett Milleville, treasurer; Mrs. Jack Gordon (Emily), recording secretary; and Albertha Koller, public information chairman.

Dues will be \$5 per year. Anyone joining the organization by December 31st, 1978 would be considered a charter member. Family dues are \$6 per year (family, add \$1.00 for each additional member over two persons). Student dues are \$3 per year, contributing member \$5 and a life membership is \$100.00.

Regular meetings of the Society are held at 7:30 p.m. on the third Monday evening of each month (except December) at St. Clara's Manor, 200 Fifth Street, telephone number 735-1507.

1998 Other programs of special interest were an evening at the county clerk's office to learn how records there may be used and to see how the records are stored. In September, Lynn Adams, Superintendent for the Restoration of Logan County Cemeteries spoke on repairing stones and how to do rubbings. Paul Beaver, curator at Lincoln College told of books available at his office and in their library that could be used for genealogical research.

In October, four members of the local society, Emily McElhaney, Ruth Payne, Nell Toomey and Emily Gordan attended a Workshop sponsored by Decatur Genealogical Society. The workshop was conducted by Laura Everton Wagstoff.

The October meeting, held at St. Clara's Manor in Lincoln, was conducted by vice president, Helen Gordy. Mr. Edward Sparks, of Springfield, was the guest speaker. Sparks is a member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints and shared his knowledge and materials made available to those members doing a genealogical research for the first time. His talk was illustrated with a film shown to the members present.

Our November meeting was in the form of an anniversary party. We were again favored by guest speaker, Mary Fouts, amateur genealogist from Tazewell County. She has a book published on the Leigh family history and is currently working in the family name of Henderson. Refreshments were served to those members present in observance of our first anniversary. It was voted upon at this meeting to dispense with the December meeting, the next meeting being January 15th of the next year.

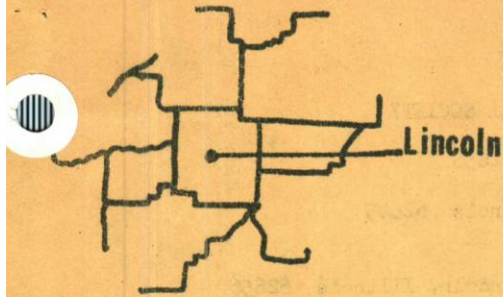

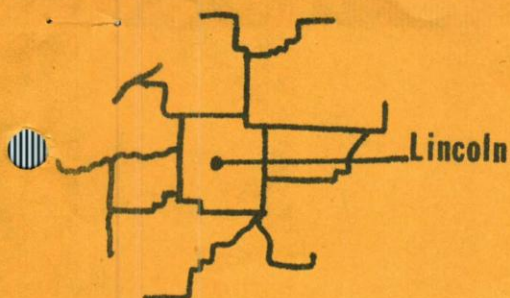

CARE OF PETS IN COLD WEATHER

The Central Illinois Responsible Pet Ownership Committee wishes to remind those of us who have outdoor pets, in these winter months, to re-check the pets accommodations:

- Plenty of EXTRA warm bedding which does not draw or hold moisture, such as straw, wood shavings and hay. DO NOT use cloth or newspapers as they hold moisture.
- Supply twice daily fresh cold water.
- Pet should have added protection from the cold winds and snow, put up wind and snow barriers.
- Clean area daily of waste material.
- Make sure your pets housing is well built to retain the body heat of your pet; with opening facing away from direction of winds.
- Check pets for fleas. (Cornstarch put in coat and bedding will help eliminate these pests.
- Indoor pets should be let out for very short periods.
