Army revamps training diet

FORT LEONARD WOOD, Mo.—At Army training sites across the nation, the mess hall is beginning to look different. Milk and juice dispensers are replacing soda fountains, and whole grains are being substituted for white bread and pasta.

The military increasingly believes that producing quality recruits starts at the dinner table during basic training, so it has started a more emphatic effort to change their eating habits. Colorcoded labels point the way to healthy items, and drill sergeants stand watch over the chow line, calling out soldiers who don't put enough fruit on their plates.

Many new soldiers have never given much thought to their diets — a problem that reflects the poor food choices of a nation with more and more obese people.

Doctrine Command. "This is a civilian problem that we're receiving and fixing."

Army leaders unveiled the approach Wednesday at Missouri's Fort Leonard Wood. It's the first substantial change to the Army's basic fitness training in decades.

The most visible changes will be in mess halls, but the program extends beyond food to overall health and fitness. The "soldier athlete" initiative is designed to prepare recruits with training methods similar to those of elite athletes — including greater use of professional trainers, physical therapists, and strength and conditioning coaches.

The system also focuses more attention on injury prevention, flexibility and mobility, coordination and aerobic endurance. Outdated exercises such as bayonet drills are being eliminated in favor of core strength workouts.

House censures Rep. Rangel

WASHINGTON - Veteran Rep. Charles Rangel, the raspy-voiced, backslapping former chairman of one of Congress' most powerful committees, was censured by his House colleagues for financial misconduct Thursday in a solemn moment of humiliation in the sunset of his career.

After the 333-79 vote, Democrat from New York's Harlem stood at the front of the House and faced Speaker Nancy Pelosi as she read him the formal resolution of censure

Responding, he admitted he had made mistakes and said he was sorry he had put fellow House members in an embarrassing posi-tion. But he suggested the winds of politics were involved as well.

"In my heart I truly feel good," Rangel said. "A lot of it has to do with the fact that I know in my heart that I am not going to be judged by this Congress, but I am going to be judged by my life."

It was only the 23rd time in the nation's history that a House mem-ber received the most severe punishment short of expulsion. Rangel committed ethical and fundraisi violations of House rules, including submitting misleading financial statements and failing to pay all his taxes, the chamber's ethics committee determined last month

Before the censure vote, the House rejected an attempt to reduce his punishment to a simple reprimand. That vote was 267-146.

The dapper congressman, wear-ing a blue suit, blue tie and a blue handkerchief, told his fellow lawmakers, "I have made serious mis-takes." But he pleaded with them to be "guided by fairness," taking account of his long record and his service in the Korean War.

Before that, the chairman of the ethics committee, Democratic Rep. Zoe Lofgren of California, said the censure her committee recom-mended was consistent with a Democratic pledge to run "the most honest, most open, most ethical Congress in history."

She said Rangel "violated the public trust" while serving in influential positions including chairman of the tax-writing Ways and Means

Rangel was at times contrite, saving that members of Congress "have a higher responsibility than most people" for ethical conduct and that senior lawmakers like himself "should act as a model" for

"I brought it on to myself," he said of his troubles.

Rep. Jo Bonner of Alabama, the op Republican on the ethics committee, said the nation's voters were paying attention to how the House dealt with a member who committed serious ethical viola

"I have no doubt the people we work for will be watching with interest," Bonner said.

The House chamber was about two-thirds full. Many members had their heads bowed over mobile phones and a few iPads. Someone's BlackBerry pinged every time an e-mail arrived.

A half-dozen members spoke in Rangel's defense, arguing a repri-mand was appropriate. A handful of Democrats applauded after one of them. Republican Rep. Peter King of New York, backed Rangel

Rangel has said repeatedly he did not intend to break any House rules, and he walked out of the ethics committee's deliberations last month because, he said, he had been treated unfairly for "good

The panel found him guilty on 11 of 13 charges and overwhelmingly recommended that he be censured

It's a difficult sunset for Rangel's long career. A jovial politician with a distinctive voice, Rangel was reelected in November with more than 80 percent of the vote despite being under an ethics cloud for more than two years.

He has argued that censure is reserved for corrupt politicians - and he's not one of them.

McCain flays military study

WASHINGTON - A doubting John McCain led Republican opposition Thursday to letting gays serve openly in the military, sternly clashing with the Pentagon's top leaders and warning that soldiers would quit in droves if Congress repealed the "don't ask don't tell"

In tense exchanges with Defense Secretary Robert Gates and Adm. Mike Mullen, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, McCain and other Republicans dismissed a Pentagon study on gays as biased and said objections by combat troops were being ignored.

Gates and Mullen defended the study, but McCain blamed politics for pushing the matter forward during wartime. He predicted Marines, in particular, would aban-don their service if they had to serve along with gays open about their sexual orientation.

"We send these young people into combat," said McCain. "We think they're mature enough to fight and die. I think they're mature enough to make a judgment on who they want to serve with and the impact on their battle effective-

Gates shot back that asking troops if they want to serve along-side gays would amount to issuing a referendum on a policy decision that should be made by Congress or the courts. The goal of the study, he said, was to find out it if it could

"Are you going to ask them if they want 15-month tours? You going to ask them if they want to be part of the surge in Iraq? That's not the way our civilian-led military has ever worked in our entire his.

McCain, a four-term Republican and former Navy pilot who endured a harrowing ordeal as a prisoner of war during the Vietnam War, has taken a higher profile on socially divisive issues since losing the 2008 presidential race to Barack Obama. He has even dif-fered with his wife, Cindy, who in a recent online video opposed the military policy and accused the government of treating gays like "second-class citizens." Frowning and lecturing Gates and other top officials who tried to defend the Obama administration's effort to repeal the gay ban, McCain scoffed at their contention that the concerns of combat troops could be addressed through time and training.

His opposition foreshadows this month's Senate debate on a bill to overturn the 1993 "don't ask, don't tell" law banning gays from serving openly in the armed forces.

Majority Leader Harry Reid, D-Nev., has promised a Senate vote. But Republicans have blocked previous attempts on procedural grounds. Further hurting chances of repeal is an agreement among the Senate GOP not to vote on any bill this month before addressing

School nutrition bill sent to Obama

WASHINGTON - More children would eat lunches and dinners at school under legislation passed Thursday by the House and sent to the president, part of first lady Michelle Obama's campaign to end childhood hunger and fight childhood obesity.

The \$4.5 billion bill approved by the House 264-157 also would tr to cut down on greasy foods and extra calories by giving the govern-ment power to decide what kinds of foods may be sold in vending machines and lunch lines. The bill could even limit frequent school bake sales and fundraisers that give kids extra chances to eat brownies and pizza.

The first lady said in a statement after the vote that she was "thrilled" about House passage. She called the bill "a groundbreaking piece of bipartisan legislation that will sig-nificantly improve the quality of meals that children receive at school."

Republicans said the bill is too expensive and an example of government overreach. Even former Alaska Gov. Sarah Palin has weighed in, bringing cookies to a speech at a Pennsylvania school last month and calling efforts to

Midwest takes snowy beating

MINNEAPOLIS - The inflatable roof of the Minnesota Vikings' stadium collapsed Sunday and roads were closed throughout the upper Midwest as a storm that dumped nearly 2 feet of snow in some areas crawled across the region.

A blizzard warning was in effect for parts of eastern lowa, southeastern Wisconsin, northwestern Illinois, and northern Michigan. according to the National Weather Service. Surrounding areas including Chicago were under winter storm warnings.

The Metrodome's Teflon roof collapsed after Minneapolis got more than 17 inches of snow. No injuries were reported. The snow-fall that ended Saturday night was one of the five biggest in Twin Cities history, National Weather Service meteorologist McOuirter said. Some surrounding communities got more than 21 inches of snow, he said.

Interstate 90 from Albert Lea to the South Dakota border and state highways remained closed. Plows that had been pulled off the roads Saturday began work at 4 a.m. Sunday but were struggling with drifts as high as 5 feet, Minnesota Department of Transportation spokeswoman Rebecca Arndt said Plow drivers also were hampered by a large number of stalled cars.

"Stalled vehicles slow them up more than big drifts," Arndt said.

Although roads were open in Wisconsin, state officials urged drivers to stay home because blowing snow severely limited visibility. Tod Pritchard, a spokesman for Wisconsin Emergency Management, said travel expected to become even more dif-

ficult in the afternoon because tem-

peratures were falling and at a cer-tain point, road salt would no longer be effective.

"We're really urging everyone to stay off the roads today and stay hunkered down at home," Pritchard said.

The storm had already dropped up to 18 inches of snow in parts of northern and central Wisconsin, he said, and light snow continued Sunday morning.

Some 420 air travelers spent the night in Grand Forks, N.D., after four planes were diverted from Minneapolis, where the storm had closed all but one of that airport's runways. After a traction truck broke down on the one operational

runway, planes circled the airport until they had to head to other regional airports for fuel.

Some passengers stayed at the airport, others got hotel rooms. "It was chaotic, it was crazy com-

pletely. We were packed like sar-dines and we were shocked," passenger Leah Edmondson told WDAZ.

Three of the four planes had left Grand Forks by late Sunday morn-

executive Hospital Stevens donned four layers of long underwear, heavy boots and a down coat before embarking on his quest Friday night.

After 40 years, SIU museum to display shelved totem pole

CARBONDALE - A Native American artifact that has sat in the archive of the University Museum for nearly 40 years is at last being put on display.

The University Museum at Southern Illinois University will be displaying a 13-foot tall totem pole that has been in its archive since

David Gugerty, museum intern and graduate student in the mas-ter's of public administration pro-gram, has focused his semester-long internship in the museum on installing the totem pole.

Gugerty said the pole came to the university museum as part of a donation of artifacts from Herb

Baker and Gwendolyn Baker Miller. He said the pole stood on display in the Baker's yard near Lake Michigan for many years, causing noticeable fading of the colors and decay of the wood.

Gugerty said the totem pole is a depiction of a Tlingit American story of Raven, a mythi-cal character. It depicts three adventures of Raven's life. He said the pole shows at the uppermost, the raven with the sun halo around its head. Below are three children of the sun who live above the earth and then raven coming back to earth bringing sunlight.

Gugerty said the middle segment of the pole shows Fog Woman with two salmon. Fog Woman brought salmon to the streams. The lower-most segment of the totem shows Raven, after living on earth with Fog Woman, going into the sea riding on a frog's back.

He said the "Sun and Raven" is a





California braces for the next wave of heavy rainfall

LOS ANGELES- If six days of pounding rain wasn't enough to dampen holiday spirits, a seventh could prove to be downright dan-

Forecasters expected heavy rains across California going into today, and authorities began evacuations late Tuesday as concern grew about potential mudslides in the wildfire-scarred foothills across the southern part of the state.

Officials ordered evacuation of 232 homes in La Canada Flintridge and La Crescenta, foothill suburbs of Los Angeles, because of fore-casts of more heavy rains on already saturated mountainsides

San Diego police evacuated dozens of homes and businesses but no structural damage was reported in the city, said Lt. Andra

A com muter rail station was closed in the city's Sorrento Valley area due to heavy rains. About a dozen homes wen evacuated in a cul-de-sac south of downtown.

A mudslide closed one street in the La Jolla area of San Diego.

Farther inland in Riverside, a surge of water swept through homeless camp near the banks of the Santa Ana River.

Rebecca Truver, 45, was holed up in her tent when her dog and her cat started acting strangely.

"They knew something was hap-pening," Truver said of her dog and cat. "Then all of a sudden the water came through up to my knees."

Three people suffered minor injuries and about 50 lost all their belongings in the flood, Ruth Record, with Come as You Are Homeless Ministries, told the Riverside Press Enterprise.



Havana may get housing boost

HAVANA - Residents have trickled away from this city for a decade, but a lack of jobs is not solely at fault. For many, there's nowhere to

A team of private and government agencies wants to address that by building 40 homes that people with low-paying jobs could rent — with the help of tax credits, if they qualify — and ulti-

"There's just no housing" in Havana and throughout Mason County, Penny Smith, director of the Mason County Housing Authority, said Monday. "I have a waiting list of 150 people," most with jobs paying less than \$10 an hour parents, she said.

The new homes would draw residents from throughout the area to Havana, she said. The city of about 3,300 people has seen its popula-tion decline by nearly 10 percent since 2000.

The project would produce "homes, not a

Tuesday night by members of the city council.

housing project," Smith recently told the Havana City Council. "This is a way to put peo-ple in decent, affordable housing."

Mayor Dale Roberts suggested the council tour a similar development in Petersburg before deciding whether to issue a letter of support for the Havana project to the Illinois Housing Development Authority. But he let his own feel-

"I think it's an awesome opportunity," for area residents and the city, he told the council.

Under the plan, Chicago-based Daveri Development Group Ltd. would enlist private investors to build the \$9.3 million project on about 14 acres of farmland just southeast of Havana, which the city would annex.

Residents would have to qualify through a scale combining income and home size. Smith said a two-bedroom home would rent for \$427 per month. Incomes would begin at a maximum of \$26,000 for a one-bedroom home. Tax credits to help in rent payments, however, would be available through the state from the federal

The "homes project," Smith said, would include on-site management. Residents would be required to maintain their properties and pass background checks including criminal and credit records. They would have the option to buy their homes after 15 years.

"If (the project) works out, we may expand it to Mason City and Manito" on a smaller scale she said. The Havana project would be the first of its kind in Mason County.

Last week Daveri and the county housing authority submitted an application to the IHDA for the HUD grant, which the IHDA would administer. The Havana project would be super vised by the county agency under a new pro-gram titled Prairieland Housing Development Services.

Roberts said the city council has until April to issue its letter of support. If it does and the grant is approved, construction could start in spring 2012, Smith said.

Phone outages irk businesses

SPRINGFIELD - Last week's disruption of Frontier Communication's landline phone service was a double-whammy for at least two businesses on Springfield's far west side.

M. J. Kellner Co., a food distributor at 5700 International Parkway, and American Metals Supply, 5651 International Parkway, reported their data lines went out the weekend before the Dec. 20 outage.

When phone lines went down that afternoon most of their communication was virtually cut

phone or computer Monday, until we forwarded our phone to an employee's cell phone, and then

when the landlines went down Monday afternoon, we lost our only remaining form of con-nection, our fax line. We had to send employees home to work from home, and it was a very unproductive day in addition to the lost sales," American Metals Supply president Chrissy

Nardini said her business contracts with AT&T for its T1 data line, but it is actually a Frontier line that AT&T is re-selling. The line went down the afternoon of Dec. 18 and was not repaired until early Dec. 21, about 2 or 3 a.m.,

"I would estimate we missed about \$20,000 in sales due to being down on Monday, which can't be recouped," she said.

"It's killing our business. We are being told

bridge. They are giving us no estimated times of repair, and this is a major problem for us and who knows how many businesses."

Dave Rikas, vice president and chief opera-tion officer of M.J. Kellner, said his business experienced the same issues with its T1 line. which is through Verizon. The business' phone service is with Frontier.

Rikas said the T1 line has been down three times in 45 days, and the company has experienced problems with it since they moved to that location 2 1/2 years ago.

"I can't blame it on an issue between Frontier and Verizon as far as the buyout is concerned.
The T1 for the data line still runs for Verizon,

viously operated by Verizon, said some outages are the result of upgrades being done to provide high-speed Internet to customers who previously didn't have it.

Others are the result of fiberoptic cuts to their lines by other companies doing trenching work near Frontier lines.

But the company is working to ensure line cuts affect fewer cus-tomers and that service interruptions become less frequent, a rep

"Frontier has completed a review of the broader network and is investing to augment redundant routes and equipment ... to offer our smaller communities and towns a quality network than our customers have had in the past few manager for Frontier's Jacksonville market, which includes communities surrounding Springfield.

Local communities now served by Frontier include Lincoln, Elkhart, Williamsville, Chatham, Waverly, Virden, Auburn, Loami, Girard, Pawnee, Sherman, Pleasant Plains, New Berlin, Divernon and Illiopolis.

Several of these towns were affected during Frontier's latest landline disruption Dec. 20 when many residents were unable to make or receive calls.

Another landline disruption that affected Chatham, Sherman and Williamsville occurred Sept. 30 while Frontier was in the process of upgrading its network for highspeed Internet expansion at the McLean Central Office.

Illinois Commerce Commission keeps records of phone line outages, and spokeswoman Beth Bosch said Frontier Communications has reported 29 outages since July 1, when it took over Illinois' Verizon lines. So far this year, 10 other companies have reported a total of 77 outages.

it's preventable so companies or whoever is responsible can fix it."

Bosch said the commission sees red flags with Frontier's reported outages.

Williamsville Village President Tom Yokley is among local officials who say it's a concern each time landline phone service goes down.

"If it happens on a continuous basis, obviously we're going to have some conversations with Frontier about that and what they're going to do to avoid these kind of things," Yokley said.

"But a lot of the times, because somebody cuts a cable, and I don't know that there's much that can be done about that.

"The biggest concern, of course, is those people that may be elderly or shut in that don't have a cell phone and don't have any way to contact people," he said. "... Fortunately, with most of our sen-ior citizens, there are contact people that do check on them, especially during those kind of times Does that mean we can't miss one? No, absolutely not."

Fire and police officials in Chatham Williamsville. Sherman say they have had to intercept 911 calls to the Sangamon County dispatch center so they could be answered locally and receive a response during service disruptions.

So far, they say they know of no

one being unable to get a response when calling 911.

Dave Dodson, executive director of the Sangamon County Combined Dispatch System and the Emergency Telephone System Department, said once the dispatch center is notified of landline phone roblems, personnel are sent to the call box in each respective village.

"We can isolate (a 911 phone call) at the call box. We're fortunate that some of the volunteer fire departments and police agencies man those phone boxes. Sometimes, we'll send dispatchers out to remote locations to answer the phones, but it's taken care of very quickly," Dodson said.

Since he joined the 911 system 2 1/2 years ago, there have been about four to five instances of landline phones being unable to reach the dispatch center, Dodson said.

"The fortunate part about it now (electronic notification systems), so if we can figure out there is no service, we can send a message or have the message sent out to these different villages that they don't have 911 and to make sure they call on a cell phone," he said.

Saylor said as Frontier continu to upgrade its network for its highspeed Internet expansion, the company is working to build relation-ships with community leaders and communication problems arise.
